

Guide to generating the Renaissance Star Screening Report

The Star Screening Report collates students' results on a single, easy to understand graph. Students are colour coded based on their intervention needs, allowing your school to put in place the additional monitoring and support that students need to progress.

Preparing the Star Screening Report (to be completed by the Core Team)

You will need to add your Star Screening Windows to Renaissance Home. Only Star tests taken within this window will be included in the report to ensure the report is an accurate reflection of students' attainment.

- 1) Go to Star > Screening, Progress Monitoring and Intervention > View Screening Dates (on the left-hand side) > Add Screening Dates or edit an existing Screening Window
- 2) Name the Screening Window (e.g. Autumn 1) and add the start and end date (maximum 30 days)
- 3) Click Save

Generating the Star Screening Report

- 1) Go to Star > Reports > Screening Report
- 2) Customise your report:
 - a. Select your Year Group or Class
 - b. Select the current Screening Window
 - c. Select all of the tick-boxes
- 4) Click View Report

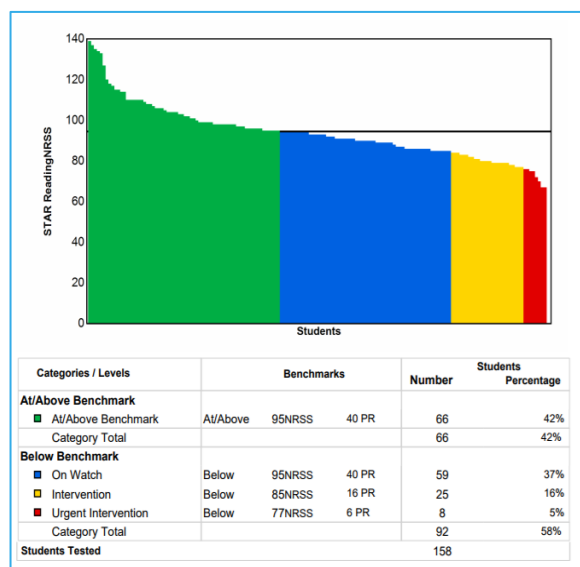
Reviewing the Star Screening Report

The Screening Report displays students' Normed Referenced Standardised Score (NRSS). This score compares each student's attainment to that of their peers; students born in the same month as them nationally.

At/Above Benchmark: students' attainment is at, or very close to, the national average (NRSS 100). Those scoring above 115 may be More Able and Talented.

On Watch: students' attainment is below the national average but may not be low enough to be eligible for additional support from the SEN team. Consider what support is available within the classroom/the English department. Monitor students' reading performance closely to help them achieve the research based best practices: 25-minutes engaged reading time and an average score of 85-95% on their Accelerated Reading quizzes.

Intervention/Urgent Intervention: students' attainment is significantly below the national average. Students will likely require support from the SEN team.
